**The Junior League of Charlotte to Host Second Annual Working Lunch
Featuring Elizabeth Smart**

Charlotte, N.C., Feb. 27, 2019 - The Junior League of Charlotte, Inc. (JLC) is pleased to announce the second annual JLC Working Lunch on April 29, 2019, at 12 p.m. at the Le Méridien Charlotte. Author, speaker, and child abduction survivor, Elizabeth Smart, will serve as this year's keynote speaker.

The abduction of Elizabeth Smart was one of the most followed child abduction cases of our time. Smart was abducted on June 5, 2002, and her captors controlled her by threatening to kill her and her family if she tried to escape. Smart was safely returned back to her family on March 12, 2003, after being held a prisoner for nine grueling months.

Through this traumatic experience, Smart has become a leading advocate for change related to child abduction, recovery programs, and national legislation. Smart has helped promote the National AMBER Alert, the Adam Walsh Child Protection & Safety Act and other safety legislation to help prevent abductions. She is also a *New York Times* best-selling author and the founder of the Elizabeth Smart Foundation.

Elizabeth will speak about her inspiring book, *Where There's Hope*, published in 2018, on what it takes to overcome trauma, find the strength to move on, and reclaim one's life.

"We are honored to host Elizabeth here in the Queen City. The Junior League of Charlotte has long-advocated for child safety, and Elizabeth's inspiring message aligns perfectly with the Junior League's mission of promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women, and improving the community through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers," says Alicia Morris-Rudd, the 2018-19 president of the JLC.
